The Fund gives investors a broad exposure to global equities in developed markets. The portfolio is actively managed and aims to achieve above benchmark returns.

LAST

The S&P 500 returned 1.7% in January. Style-wise, momentum, value, quality, lowvolatility and size factors generated outperformance. Over the month, 10-year bond yields rose to 4% from 3.9%, with investors starting to price out very aggressive rate cuts from the curve. Fed rhetoric was a little more hawkish, with Chair Powell hinting that officials would not cut rates simply in response to mechanical disinflation. Powell also said that a March rate cut would be unlikely, and that quantitative tightening would continue at its recent pace. With bond yields rising, it was understandable that short-duration factors like value added value. What was interesting was also the outperformance of defensive factors, with higher bond yields being a headwind to large and expensive growth/technology stocks.

Although defensive value did well in January, it was noteworthy that commodity exposures within the value bucket underperformed on concerns about China. Also, leveraged exposures like banks have lagged the market because of concerns about regional banks, commercial real estate and system liquidity.



We have positive weights on size, quality, value, and growth. But our smallest weighting is on growth. We are neutral on momentum.

Our factor positioning reflects the view that bond yields could still rise on a more hawkish Fed, heavy bond issuance and inflation concerns. We can see that the US consumer is reaccelerating, leading world growth higher. But we also see a tension between mid-cycle economic indicators and late-cycle asset allocation signals. The risk is that reaccelerating world growth and sticky inflation drive up bond yields, and that expensive growth stocks underperform, weighing on the broader market. Indeed, our forward-looking measures of bond-equity correlation are still suggesting that stocks and bonds are likely to move together in the near future. In our view, if this state of high correlation changes, it will be because the Fed allows credit and financial conditions to tighten via higher-for-longer rates and tightening liquidity in the system. Therefore, bonds might catch a bid because credit and equities underperform.
